

What happens if I live in another state or country and I have a non-recordable document that needs to be notarized?

If you need to apostille a non-recordable document in the State of Texas, your documents **must first be notarized by a Texas notary public**. No other state or country's notary public can notarize the documents.

As of October 1st, 2023 you can now use a Texas e-notary (remote notary, virtual notary, electronic notary, online notary) to notarize your non-recordable document virtually so you don't have to travel back to Texas to get them notarized in person like people had to do before.
